

Jester Park is pet-friendly! Visitors are welcome to take their dogs with them while exploring the park trails and grounds, as long as they follow the BARK Ranger rules.

Bag your pet's waste. Bag dispensers and trash bins can be found along the walking trails.

Always use a leash. Keeping your dog on a leash helps protect them and others.



Respect wildlife. Remember that squirrels and birds like to be left alone!

Know where you can go. While pets are welcome outside, only service animals are allowed inside the nature center.
